This young man has served 3 tours of duty and suffers greatly from PTSD. His family could no longer keep him with them. Happily, Steps House could take him, and he is doing well in the program. You can help with this ministry by putting items in the Steps House basket, which is also in the small room behind the coat rack. Currently, Steps House especially needs towels and small appliances, such as coffee makers, toasters, microwaves, and toaster ovens.
