Feeding the Hungry

We have many opportunities next weekend to take care of “the least of these who are members of God’s family,” including several FISH opportunities and preparing and serving lunch at KARM. We have been blessed to be a blessing.

- **FRIDAY, DECEMBER 1**, at 1:00 PM, at the FISH PANTRY, able-bodied people are invited to unload the truck, taking groceries into the pantry. This is not wimpy work; expect to get tired and feel real good about doing your part to feed hungry people.
- **SATURDAY, DECEMBER 2**, at 9:00 AM, at KARM, prepare and serve lunch. Let Chuck Utesch know that you will be there.
- **SATURDAY, DECEMBER 2**, at 1:00 PM, at the FISH PANTRY, load up and then deliver grocery bags to hungry people. Let Donna Ellstrom know that you are available.
- **SUNDAY, DECEMBER 3**, at about 2:00 PM, at the FISH PANTRY, be part of the assembly line to put cans and boxes and bags of food into grocery bags. Jobs require some bending and/or lifting. Double bagging the grocery bags is tedious, but not too strenuous. Preparing packaging for recycling is not too strenuous. The youth will be there, but some adult help is always a good plan.

Gifts for Mobile Meals Clients

If you would like to donate a gift for a Mobile Meals recipient, you can put it in the designated basket in the hallway and Donna E. will get it to the Office on Aging. Suggested items are for personal care, comfort (like gloves and throws), home & kitchen (like hand towels and jar openers), and utility (like flashlights and pens). Think Dollar Tree and just browse the aisles looking for inexpensive gift ideas. The basket will be there through December 10.

Justice Knox

This past Monday night, ten members of Peace attended the Knox Justice meeting this past Monday night at Tabernacle Baptist. Peace was included in the 200+ people from 20+ Knoxville congregations who voted to choose Affordable Housing/homelessness as an issue to work on this coming year. Justice Knox will meet and work with City and County agency officials and others to research the causes of the shortage of affordable housing and ways to increase the availability of suitable housing. The causes of the lack of affordable housing include rising rents and gentrification, and have forced people into poor housing and even homelessness.
