Martin Luther King Jr. Day

Pray that our actions, words and service for the sake of our neighbor will be inspired and guided by the witness and example of these bold leaders.

Pray for ELCA churchwide staff, volunteers and planning committees as they prepare for “boundless: God beyond measure,” the 2021 ELCA Youth Gathering in Minneapolis. Ask the Spirit to guide them as they help youth, young adults and adults catch a glimpse and develop a deeper understanding of Christ’s love and what it means to live a life filled with God.

Give thanks that God shows no partiality or exclusivity in sharing love, mercy and forgiveness; the good news of Jesus Christ is for everyone and every nation!

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity begins today. Welcoming Refugees and Other Immigrants

Some people of Peace have expressed concern and empathy for immigrants and refugees. It is good to know that the ELCA also has concern and empathy. Through ELCA World Hunger and Lutheran Disaster Response some immediate needs are met.

Through ELCA AMMPARO (Accompanying Migrant Minors with Protection, Advocacy, Representation and Opportunities) children and families from Central America are welcomed and supported. And finally, the ELCA supports Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Service (LIRS), founded 80 years ago by predecessor churches of the ELCA.

According to an article in *Living Lutheran*, June, 2019, there are things we can do to answer these concerns: Observe Refugee Sunday, Join Circle of Welcome (an LIRS program), Become an AMMPARO welcoming congregation, Speak up, especially to your legislators, and Be a bridge builder, i.e., be kind

when you meet people from other parts of the world. There are copies of this *Living Lutheran* article on the Outreach board. Feel free to take a copy for yourself.

Also there are local groups working with immigrants in our community. These groups welcome your support and involvement. Bridge Refuge Services, a nonprofit agency, resettles refugees and handles their case management. Knoxville Internationals Network (KIN) is a faith-based organization that serves all internationals by holding citizenship and English classes and other services. If you are interested in becoming involved locally see the Outreach board for more information.

THOUGHTFUL FAITH

John 1:29-42

John the Baptist's witness to Jesus initiates a chain of testimony as his disciples begin to share with others what they have found.

The next day he saw Jesus coming toward him and declared, "Here is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world! This is he of whom I said, 'After me comes a man who ranks ahead of me because he was before me.' I myself did not know him; but I came baptizing with water for this reason, that he might be revealed to Israel." And John testified, "I saw the Spirit descending from heaven like a dove, and it remained on him. I myself did not know him, but the one who sent me to baptize with water said to me, 'He on whom you see the Spirit descend and remain is the one who baptizes with the Holy Spirit.' And I myself have seen and have testified that this is the Son of God." The next day John again was standing with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he exclaimed, "Look, here is the Lamb of God!"

The two disciples heard him say this, and they followed Jesus. When Jesus turned and saw them following, he said to them, "What are you looking for?" They said to him, "Rabbi" (which translated means Teacher), "where are you staying?" He said to them, "Come and see." They came and saw where he was staying, and they remained with him that day. It was about four o'clock in the afternoon. One of the two who heard John speak and followed him was Andrew, Simon Peter's brother. He first found his brother Simon and said to him, "We have found the Messiah" (which is translated Anointed). He brought Simon to Jesus, who looked at him and said, "You are Simon son of John. You are to be called Cephas" (which is translated Peter).
