Important Emergency Information

- Representatives from the Karns Fire Department and the Knoxville Fire Department spoke to the Women of Peace March 21, 2017. We learned some vital information.
- Do not hesitate to **call 911** if you have a concern. The dispatcher will route your call appropriately. Fire Department personnel are on call 24 hours a day.
- Put **ICE information** on your cell phone. ICE stands for "in case of emergency." For instance, enter husband Hunk Jones, 555-5555. Smart phones have a special way to put this information in. It is available to someone without unlocking anything. If you are unsure how to do this, ask a grandchild.
- Make a **list of all the medications** you take. Put one copy of this list in a pill bottle in your refrigerator or attach it to the front of the refrigerator; the fire department knows to look there.
- If you live alone, seriously consider getting an **alert system**, something you would wear always with a button to signal for help. Also, so that the fire department would not need to break down your door if you needed help but could not get to the door to unlock it, get a "Knox box." These boxes are almost impossible to break into, would contain your door key, and can be opened only by the fire department. Ask your fire department how to get one of these boxes.
- **Smoke detectors**, the older variety, should have their batteries changed twice a year (at time changes) and should be replaced at ten years. Newer varieties come with sealed ten-year batteries. Toss and replace after the ten years.
- Almost everyone should also have a **carbon monoxide detector**. If you have anything using gas or oil or if you have an attached garage, you need the CO detector.

- **Home fire extinguishers** should be shaken twice a year or more; the dial should be in the green zone. They should be checked at a fire extinguisher company once a year and tossed and replaced after 12 years.
- If you have a breaker that keeps tripping, have it checked by a certified electrician.
