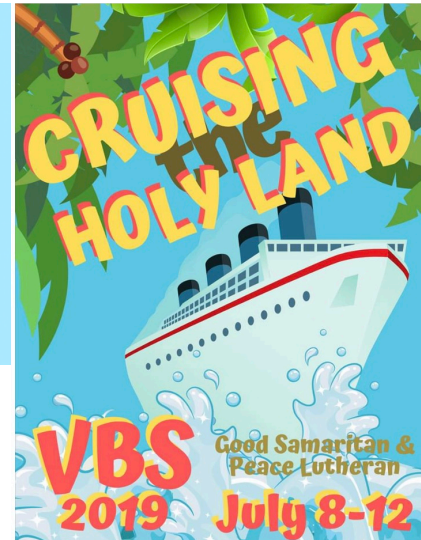

The Rev. Kevin L. Strickland was elected June 2 to serve a six-year term as bishop of the Southeastern Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). The election took place during the synod assembly, held May 30 – June 2 at the Chattanooga (Tenn.) Convention Center. Strickland was elected on the fifth ballot, with 199 votes.
